ECMN Member Wins Human Rights Award



(St. Paul, MN; June 1, 2022) Priscilla Hagerman, who works as Program and Operations Assistant for World Without Genocide, was awarded the Inna Meiman Human Rights Award on April 28, 2022. The award honors a University of Minnesota student who has shown a commitment to protecting and preserving human rights.

Hagerman graduated from the University of Minnesota in May with a BA degree in Global Studies and Geography and a minor in Political Science. She graduated from Minnetonka High School in 2018. Her parents, John and Jan Hagerman, have lived in Minnetonka for more than 20 years. She has been a lifelong member of the Episcopal Church of Minnesota and has attended Episcopal Youth Music Camp as both a camper and staff member for many years.

At World Without Genocide, Hagerman has worked extensively on women's rights issues, particularly on the Cities for CEDAW campaign. This national campaign engages city councils and leaders with CEDAW, the UN Convention on the Elimination of Discrimination against Women, to support and enhance women's rights in their own municipalities.

Hagerman conducted research on women's rights and spoke at public events to advance this campaign successfully in Northfield, MN and in Appleton, Wisconsin.

Seven cities in Minnesota have passed resolutions supporting CEDAW: Duluth, Edina, Minneapolis, Northfield, Red Wing, Richfield, and Saint Paul. Hagerman plans to advocate for CEDAW to Minnetonka.

World Without Genocide promotes education and action to protect innocent people, prevent genocide, prosecute perpetrators, and remember those affected by genocide.
