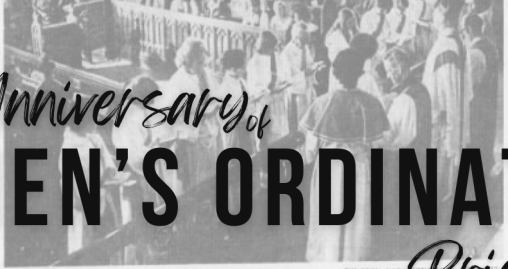


WASHINGTON — Former Treasury Secretary John P. Connally was indicted Monday on five felony counts in connection with the controversial 1971 Nixon Administration milk-price ruling.

Connally, 57, was charged by the Watergate special prosecutor, J. Edgar Hoover, with accepting a \$10,000 bribe from a large dairy farmer to persuade the President to support, and then conspiring to influence a Federal judge and a Federal grand jury to bring a charge against a milk producer by a public official.

The former Treasury secretary still former governor of Texas, a Democrat turned Republican, is the fourth former Nixon Cabinet member to be charged or to plead guilty in relation to administration scandals.

Indicted with Connally was Texas attorney Jake Jacobsen, 58, charged with one count of "giving an illegal



The vote as on Saturday night, was bipartisan, with seven Republicans joining all 21 Democrats in approving the article.

A vote on a third article and debate on at least two additional charges are expected today as the first Presidential impeachment in 106 years moves consideration by the full House of Representatives.

The so-called "abuse of power" article is the second of two originally proposed. Article I, charging a Watergate cover-up, was passed Saturday on a vote of 27-11.

Article II charged that the President misled the liberal House Judiciary Committee charged that the President engaged in a pattern of illegal activity resulting from misuse of the investigatory power of the Internal Revenue Service.
